Enrichment & Community access

We run curriculum enrichment trips throughout the year, recent examples include a visit to Kettles Yard in Cambridge where our young people worked with a ceramic artist and a History trip to Duxford Museum.

We have reward trips each week which are determined by pupil voice and have recently included trips to Extreme 360, bowling, pool or out for a hot chocolate in St Neots cafes local to the school site. High value rewards are saved for the end of term and suited for trips such as theatre visits or a whole school trip to the seaside, a theme park. Again these are decided upon by student voice. All these types of rewards trips have not necessarily been included on the school trips list.

We continue to welcome regular visitors from the community, including our local PCSO, local businesses and members of our governing body. We hope to continue to expand this offer throughout this academic year.
