Please ask Simon to radio if you need a drink and someone can bring a jug of water to the room.  We used to have jugs of water and cups for every room, but some people ruined this by throwing water around. Do you feel this is something that we could bring back and try again?
We would like a better punch bag.	Punch bags are expensive and staff need specific training to use them properly. Unfortunately I've witnessed too much inappropriate use with it recently, hence why it broke in the first place (flying jump

	kicks are not acceptable!). A new one won't be bought until people are trained in appropriate use for your own safety.
We would like a fish tank in school.	I do love a fish tank in a school, however at the moment I don't think there is anywhere suitable for one. I do have a plan for the front of school area, however we need it clear of students before I can do anything with it. Watch this space
We like the mats on the therapy room floor.	So do I, and we are very lucky that Dreamdrops charity donated them to us.
We need more house competitions	I agree! What type of competitions would you like staff to organise. Please remember there should be something for everyone!?
We need another minibus.	I've already enquired with the trust about another vehicle. We would need to fund raise a lot of money for one, so at the moment it's better to borrow one from one of the other schools.
Food portions are too small.	I will speak to Edwards and Blake about this and see if we can get slightly bigger portions.
Staff need protecting more because they get hit by students.	Assaults at RMA have only occurred recently when a student has been in crisis, but staff are well trained to deal with these situations and our priority is to keep students safe. The largest problem we have are students been nosey, wanting to see what is happening, or trying got antagonise a person and refusing to move away which makes the situation worse. More training will be happening next term and I hope that this message gets back to students that it isn't ok to refuse to follow instructions as it is that behaviour which puts staff members at risk of getting hurt.
We need a padded room again where we can punch the walls.	This will not be happening.  The padded room is for high level physical restraints, and we do not have those situations in this school as they are dangerous for both the staff and student, and a really unpleasant thing to experience. The walls aren't designed for students to punch, as was evident when I took all the pads away last year as there were large holes behind them in the plasterboard. I am surprised that more people didn't get broken wrists!  Regulation can be achieved without hitting things, and this is why the school is much safer and calmer now than it was two years ago. The pads just encouraged physical aggression and inappropriate physical

	contact. For all our safety, they won't be coming back.
We like the bean bags, can we have more.	Hopefully as we move into the summer
	term, if students can prove they can look
	after the equipment, we will purchase more
	for you, but they are expensive so look after
	them.
We should have learner elections.	We always wanted to implement a prefect
	and head people role in school through
	elections. We wanted to tie this in with an
	election process so you could have it as a
	learning experience as part of Fundimental
	British Values, but we've not had that
	opportunity yet.
