



CURRICULUM – Art Autumn Term 2

Key stage 3

What is being taught?

Key stage 3 will be developing their pencil skills this term, looking at tone, blending and texture. This will develop their confidence and awareness of drawing objects with a more realistic finish.

How is it being taught?

We will be looking closely at tonal values and practicing how to use appropriately. There will be a focus on tonal values and developing our understanding of how shading, and light can bring a 2D object into a 3D life. We will be playing with different media to transfer these skills. The intention is then to practise these to build confidence and reinforcing the learning.

Key stage 4

What is being taught?

Key stage 4 pathway students will be looking to student the GCSE syllabus. Each learner will be working on a personal project that is in tune with their personal tastes and interests. Students can work with a range of media and develop their work in a range of exciting formats.

How is it being taught?

Over this term we will be focussing on contextual references, artist studies and how outside influences inform our practise. We will revisit past skills learnt and explore and experiment with media and techniques to inspire our work and ideas.
